

Mr. Craven,

I am writing in response to the concerns you shared at our November 9, 2017 meeting. We met regarding an incident on October 17, 2017, at Jason Lee Middle School. During the meeting, Mrs. Craven, Naatosi, Mr. Lookinghawk and yourself shared several concerns. In response, Ms. Everidge and I agreed to review your concerns of the incident and the district's response to the incident.

One concern raised by Mr. Lookinghawk was lack of supervision on the playground. In reviewing supervision at Jason Lee during lunch time, there are four adults assigned to the playground with a minimum of two always present. One assigned individual is always a security officer. When the incident ended, the other student immediately walked to the security officer and self-disclosed his actions. Both boys then went to the office with the security officer. This information is based on witness statements including Naatosi's. None of the adults witnessed the physical altercation, but two student names were provided by Naatosi and the other boy. Both were interviewed. Unfortunately, the name Naatosi provided stated he was inside doing homework club at the time and wasn't on the playground. The second student witness stated Naatosi and the other boy were arguing and may have been pushing each other prior to the other boy punching Naatosi a few times in the head.

A second concern raised was the school's response to Naatosi's injuries. The boys were immediately brought to the office by the security officer. Naatosi was treated in the health room and given ice for his eye. He complained of a loose tooth and had an abrasion on his left eye. He did not complain of any dizziness, headache, nausea or other symptoms. He remained calm. Mr. Scheidel spoke with Naatosi for a couple minutes, called your home and spoke with you. You immediately responded to Jason Lee. You then took Naatosi out of school.

A third concern you raised was the requirement of the school to notify law enforcement. You have cited U.S. Code on several occasions to support your concern. Law Enforcement was not called due to the judgement of the principal that a crime had not been committed, and that the boys were eleven years old. In addition, there were not any known previous issues between Naatosi and the other boy. I have since learned that Deputy Boyse of CCSO did submit a report to Juvenile Court. Juvenile Court has chosen not to take action on the incident. Based on VPS Policy 5159.1 Prohibited Activities, Policy 5146.1 Zero Tolerance and Regulation 5146.1 Zero Tolerance, the principal did take appropriate action regarding discipline.

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A fourth concern you raised was Naatosi being out of school. As stated previously, the principal has adjusted the other student's schedule so they will not have any classes together. In addition, the principal will notify key staff to monitor the students. He will ask staff to immediately intervene if anything seems problematic and report any actions or statements that seem to be in response to the previous issue. Finally, the principal will meet with Naatosi to let him know that he can go to any adult in the school for help at any time if he is feeling uncomfortable or unsafe. Naatosi shared in our meeting that he has not witnessed bullying or other threatening behaviors at Jason Lee other than some snacks taken and personal belongings looked into by the same boy. These concerns have been addressed with the other student.

We heard Mrs. Craven's, Naatosi's and your desire for Naatosi to return to school. We too want Naatosi to return to school and access his full educational opportunity. We are confident we can do this at Jason Lee Middle School which Naatosi shared is his first choice. If Naatosi and/or the family would like to seek another school option, we will do everything feasible to accommodate the request. Please let me know your choice and I will help coordinate with the building.
